	<p>David Brody, CBN Capitol Hill Correspondent - Soon, Congress will begin debating the idea of providing vouchers to low income students across the country. In Compton, California Los Angeles is just a few miles away. You're looking at a city that competes every year for a title it doesn't want: murder capitol of the U.S. Betty Harris wants to get her 13-year-old grandson out of the failing public schools. The problem in Compton is that there are no better performing schools in the entire district. Of the nearly 32,000 kids in the schools, only 20 percent are considered proficient in English language arts, same thing for math. The district has acknowledged in the past that not a single student has actually transferred to a better performing school under The No Child Left Behind Act. The Bush administration wants to spend \$100 million on a school choice program if Congress approves this opportunity scholarship for kids, money would be available, in the form of a voucher, for students to go to a private school, if they choose. But there will be a fight over this proposed voucher plan. The teachers' unions in this country are powerful and have no desire to see children leave public schools, because every time a student leaves, that means less federal money for the school district.</p>

	<p>Jay Sekulow Chief Counsel for American Center for Law and Justice discusses a legal issue in a Dover, Pennsylvania school district and the issue of intelligent design with Pat Monaghan, Stuart Roth and Geoff Surtees, Sr. Counsels, ACLJ. The issue is over the school district making a statement once a year at the beginning of the Biology term on the origins of mankind and they say there are other theories other than evolution and there are books and resources available in the library. This resulted in a federal court case from the ACLU and is based on the 1987 Supreme Court decision to ban the teaching creationism in public schools because it was said to advance a religious belief. A clip from CBN News is shown regarding the status of this trial that has been running for five weeks. A roll-in is shown of a school district in California where Islam is being taught in a highly detailed study. Some parents were shocked that the students were asked to act out Islamic traditions. Max and his wife Judy have been married for 16 years. But before they tied the knot, Judy got pregnant. Not wanting to be parents yet, they agreed to end the pregnancy. "When I lay down on that table, I knew it was wrong," Judy admitted. "I knew that I was making the wrong decision. It was horrendous pain -- it was very painful. And when Judy wanted to talk about the abortion, Max just wanted to put the whole thing behind them. "I didn't want to talk about it -- sort of like, out of sight, out of mind," he said. "And if we don't talk about it, I wouldn't have to deal with it." Abortion is often trumpeted as a quick, guilt-free solution to a tough situation. After more than 30 years of abortion-on-demand, the evidence is growing that for millions of people, abortion is a lingering, painful experience. It even has a name: Post-Abortion Syndrome. The symptoms include depression, grief, sexual dysfunction, drug and alcohol abuse, and even attempted suicide.</i>

The problem is, judges are overturning them. Like just recently in Georgia, and before that in Nebraska. Massachusetts already has gay marriage sanctioned by their supreme court. The mosque sits unfinished, construction having all but stopped last year when contributions dried up. The very founder of the Islamic society of Boston, Abdurahman Alamoudi, is in federal prison after pleading guilty to charges related to a bizarre plot by Moammar Ghadafi to assassinate Crown Prince Abdullah of Saudi Arabia. The Treasury Department said Alamoudi was a fundraiser for al-Qaeda. The ISB admits that most of the funding for the mosque has come from the Middle East, including Saudi Arabia, where schoolchildren are still taught to hate Christians and Jews. And when the mosque is completed, under an agreement with the City of Boston, it will be used to educate the people of Boston about Islam.

The law now requires someone in the military to serve only one year of active duty to qualify for citizenship. The requirement used to be three years. In addition, because we're fighting the War on Terror, President Bush signed the Expedited Naturalization Executive Order in July of 2002. It allows immigrant soldiers to immediately apply for citizenship. What used to take years, now can take just months. At this time, illegal or undocumented immigrants are not allowed to join the armed forces to speed up the citizenship process. The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services have granted posthumous citizenship to 75 service members during the War on Terror.

Twelve-year old Leslie Pierce remembers the day, two years ago, when she decided to stop eating food. Phil and Barb Pierce are Leslie's parents. No matter how hard they tried, they couldn't force their daughter to eat. After two months, Leslie's condition went from scary to almost deadly, as she got down to a skeletal 52 pounds. "We admitted her into the psychiatric hospital, and they gave her 48 hours to do it on her own," Barb said. "Within those 48 hours she lost a few more pounds, and her medical team advised us that if we do not get a feeding tube in her in the next five days, she probably would be gone." According to the National Eating Disorders Association, 42 percent of 1st through 3rd grade girls want to be thinner. Eighty percent of pre-teen girls are dieting, and those who diet are eight times more likely to develop an eating disorder.

Today, advocates for the Fairness Doctrine are calling for a comeback to balance a media they say is dominated by an "overwhelmingly right-wing view."
