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Melissa Charbonneau of CBN News: As thousands of wounded service men and women return from Iraq and Afghanistan, concerns are rising about how the military cares for its own. Defense Secretary Robert Gates has named an independent panel to review procedures at Walter Reed and Bethesda Navel hospitals following reports of substandard conditions and red tape that plague returning troops. Meanwhile, the thousands of American heroes, their lives forever changed by severe injury in the line of duty, are fighting back to rebuild their lives. The men and their wives talked about how they deal with months of painful rehabilitation, the unforeseen costs of recovery, and their hopes for the future, and how a private charity is stepping in to help. Adding to the emotional and physical shock of injury or amputation, the returning wounded also worry about money, and the cost of travel and hotels for family who come to help. But the Keeslars and the Lambs are getting help from Fisher House, a charity that provides free lodging near military hospitals -- transportation, even groceries. "We need to reunite the families," he said, "because we believe a family's love is pretty good medicine" But waiting lists are long as the casualties come in. If the money holds out, Fisher House plans to build 20 more homes, like this one in San Antonio, over the next four years.

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Heather Sells CBN News reports - You may have heard recent reports that 51 percent of women are living without a spouse. But the fact is Americans have become less likely to marry. Social scientists say much of the decline in marriage results from people delaying it. The median age of first marriage for women climbed from 20 in 1960 to 26 in 2005 -- and for men, it jumped from 23 to 27. Couples who choose to live together also threaten marriage. Since 1960, that number has increased ten-fold. Today, researchers estimate that a quarter of unmarried women aged 25 to 39 are living with a partner. Despite substantial research that shows that couples who live together before marriage are more likely to get divorced, many young people believe living together is in their best interest. Marital experts say that living together rips at the very idea of marriage as a lifetime covenant. So what's the future of marriage? With our tendency to delay it, live together, divorce, and viewing it as generally painful, social scientists believe it will continue to decline. Eventually, they believe the marriage rate will plateau -- like the divorce rate has. In the meantime, they say, we need to teach the value of marriage to a new generation. Ultimately, marriage advocates say we must explain the benefits of marriage to young people who may not be convinced. That means explaining the research that shows married people -- and their kids -- are better off economically, socially and physically.

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Erick Stakelbeck CBN News reports - What if terrorists could steal your credit card information online? Or hack into a U.S. government website to remove their names from a no-fly list? Even steal U.S. military and national security secrets? These may sound like scenarios straight out of the hit show *24*, but for a growing number of rogue regimes, third-world economies and terrorist groups, the prospect of attacking America electronically is all too real. Andrew Colarik is a cyber security expert and author of *Cyber Terrorism: Political and Economic Implications*. Colarik said, "Countries such as Peru, Iran, United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Croatia, Vietnam -- there's a large litany of them -- have been actively attacking our power and utility infrastructure, they've been attacking our financial systems -- going after our technology-based companies." Dr. Walid Phares is a terrorism expert and author of *Future Jihad: Terrorist Strategies against the West*. He said, "They have concentrated over the past few years on creating a cyber-jihad war room. Many of their affiliates, not just in the Middle East -- including in the West, possibly in the United States -- have been focusing on trying to bring down Web sites, trying to break into security Web sites, and also possibly trying to wreak havoc in the financial part of this international Internet consortium." He told CBN News of a recent U.S. government warning that al-Qaeda is seeking to attack online stock trading and banking websites. The U.S. government says it's already taken measures to prevent such attacks. A spokesman from the Cyber-Security Division of the Department of Homeland Security told CBN News.

One panelist said, "I am going to encourage you to have sex and encourage you to use drugs appropriately. Why I am going to take that position is because you are going to do it anyway." "This really goes to the end of something we're seeing more and more," said Jim Pfaff of the Colorado Family Institute, "not only in this state but across the country, where kids are being encouraged to experiment with sex." Clay Jones of Second Glance Ministries says that even 10 to 14 year olds are becoming sexually active -- so many, the CDC for the first time ever is studying sexual disease rates among girls that age. "Those young women between the ages of 10 and 14 contracted more cases of Chlamydia than all the women between the ages of 40 and 50 put together." He said, "We're seeing young people seven, eight and nine years old beginning to act out sexually in ways we've never seen before." Dr. Gary Rose of The Medical Institute says that if parents can't trust the schools to teach abstinence, at least they can do it themselves. Rose said, "More than 90 percent of young adolescents and adolescents in general, want a very strong abstinence message from their parent ... And the problem is, so many of us as parents are uncomfortable talking about it."

They either didn't have insurance or didn't have the 'right kind' of insurance. Are you covered if a natural disaster should strike? Hurricane Katrina washed away Mike Taylor's Long Beach, Mississippi home. All that remains is the concrete driveway. Taylor and his family are in the same hole as many disaster victims: They had homeowner's insurance, but not the right kind. The standard homeowner's policy covers wind-related damage and wind-driven rain-related damage. It does not cover flood damage. The insurance company ruled flooding caused Mike's losses, and he did not have flood insurance. Taylor decided not to buy flood insurance, not because he was trying to save a buck, but because prior to Katrina, the property that his home sat on was not considered a flood plain - even though, ironically the Gulf is just three blocks away. But after the storm blew through, that all changed. Thanks to Katrina, the area is now considered a flood zone. Still, the insurance company isn't budging, and Mike has to cut his losses and move on.

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Melissa Charbonneau CBN News Washington – Some Democrats in Congress want to resurrect a defunct federal policy they say would protect free speech. But when Congress returns from summer break, Republicans say they'll try to block revival of the Fairness Doctrine. They say it would muzzle conservatives on talk radio. Should government regulations decide how long you can listen to a liberal radio host like Al Franken - or a conservative commentator like Rush Limbaugh? That's a question that Congress will decide as the Senate considers a revival of the Fairness Doctrine, a 1949 law that once required broadcasters to give equal time to opposing political views or face fines by the Federal Communications Commission. After some defeats in court, the doctrine was finally discarded in 1987 by Ronald Reagan's FCC. Many believed it actually stifled rather than encouraged debate. Station managers didn't want to deal with government interference, so they shied away from discussion of controversial issues. Sen. Diane Feinstein, D-CA, said on Fox News Sunday, "In my view, talk radio tends to be one-sided. It also tends to be dwelling in hyperbole. It's explosive. It pushes people to, I think, extreme views without a lot of information." But in the House, half of the Democrats sided with Republicans to overwhelmingly pass a bill banning the FCC or any future president from re-imposing the policy. Indiana Republican Congressman Mike Pence, R-IN, sponsored the House measure. A former radio show host, he calls it the "unfairness doctrine." Pence said it 'is nothing short of a government mandate and management of the free speech on the airwaves of America." Gordon Robertson CBN host talks live with Congressman Mike Pence about how this issue resurfaced and talks about the Hate Crime legislation and how that will affect pastors. We need a Broadcasters Freedom Act to protect free speech and encouraged people to contact their representative in Washington.

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Dale Hurd CBN News: Washington is mandating a five-fold increase in ethanol production over the next 10 years and is encouraging the production of "flex-fuel" vehicles that will run on 85 percent ethanol or "E-85." Policy analyst Jerry Taylor at the free market CATO Institute thinks corn ethanol is a dumb idea. "The only reason any ethanol is being produced today in the United States, given the price, is because of politics," Taylor said. "If you talk to people in the refining industry, they'll tell you that if there weren't a federal gun at their heads they wouldn't touch this stuff. It's wildly expensive. The reason we use ethanol is that the government forces us to use ethanol." Actually, the government also doles out incentives in the form of three different ethanol subsidies to entice industry to increase production. They amount to corporate handouts that totaled more than \$5 billion last year. But Taylor insists the government's fondness for ethanol is not so much about energy security as it is about politics. The National Cattleman's Beef Association told Business Week that the "...ethanol binge is insane." And the beef, pork, and poultry industries are begging Congress to end the ethanol subsidy, because they say the rising price of corn feed is driving up the prices of their products. Corn is used in all kinds of human foods, and some say the demand for corn ethanol is why grocery prices have increased. Taylor said, "Capital investors will put their money into that technology because they hope to make a profit. Only when a technology can't attract private capital do they come knocking on the taxpayer's door." But no matter, Washington likes ethanol, whether some think it makes economic sense or not.

David Brody CBN News DES MOINES, Iowa - The cornfields of Iowa, just like the fields in the baseball movie, have been a field of dreams for presidential wannabes. Whether it was previous unknowns like Bill Clinton or Jimmy Carter, their dreams of the presidency have always started here. Performing well in Iowa puts you on the map, gives you momentum and can catapult you to victory. And so the candidates come here, one by one, talking to Iowa's savvy voters one town hall and one coffee shop at a time. "There's nothing more important in our society and for our future than our children," Rudy Giuliani said. In 2004, seven states held primaries on one day in February. But in 2008, February 5 becomes the new Super Tuesday when 20 states will be up for grabs, including big prizes like California and New York. The key Florida primary has now moved to January 29. Candidates will likely change strategies and move more attention to those states and away from Iowa, which will hold its caucus on January 14. Months ago, Giuliani and fellow Republican John McCain decided not to compete in Saturday's straw poll. They say it's because they got a late start organizing, not necessarily because of its lack of importance. All campaigns face the Iowa question. A few months ago, a memo circulating in Hillary Clinton's campaign proposed skipping Iowa and running a campaign that is more focused on other early primary states and winning this new national primary. Obama chugs along in Iowa also. He told CBN News that for political pundits to overlook Iowa's importance is a big mistake. When it comes to spending time with voters here, Democrat John Edwards and Republican Mitt Romney could almost be considered honorary hawkeyes. No matter what happens on the so-called big day of February 5, these Iowa voters will register judgment first on who stays and who goes. History shows that any other candidate that wins or places ahead of the front runners automatically becomes a force to be reckoned with. Some candidates may experience a nightmare but for one fortunate Democrat and Republican, Iowa may indeed be the start of their field of dreams.

CBN News White House Correspondent Melissa Charbonneau WASHINGTON - An early primary season means voters have less time to get to know the presidential contenders before next year's election. Televised political debates are designed to shed light on the candidates. But are they more show than substance? For years critics have complained these political showdowns are too crowded, too commercial, and too much like pop-culture. Gingrich, a potential presidential contender, is among the harshest critics of today's debates. He says the format is "stunningly dangerous" and no way to pick a president, especially in a post 9-11 world. With an occasional lightning bolt to accent an argument on abortion, debates can range from mildly amusing to mind-numbingly dull. Most experts agree, they are no predictor of how good a president a candidate could be. "You can be a great debater and a bad president," said Stephen Hess, presidential scholar at The Brookings Institution. "You can be a bad debater and a good president." Hess says serious, in-depth discussions would be more useful to voters. But with the rise of the Internet, more media outlets, and special interest sponsors, some critics say debates have morphed into little more than partisan press conferences. The Gingrich reform proposal includes a series of nine, 90-minute debates. Each week from Labor Day to Election Day, the two party nominees would tackle a single policy issue. No rules. No time limits. And the candidates must offer solutions. Some say moving toward Lincoln-Douglas style debates instead of Youtube would give voters a glimpse of how well candidates grasp the issues. "We need leaders who think about their role as a country in history, not just their personal ambition," Gingrich said. The next presidential debate, featuring Democrats in Iowa, is slated for Sunday night.

CBN News Terror Analyst Erick Stakelbeck: The director of national intelligence says the threat of Islamic terrorism on American soil is very real. "Their intent is to effect an attack with mass casualties. A secondary attempt would be political or infrastructure targets," Director of National Intelligence Michael McConnell told NBC's *Meet the Press*. Part of the CIA's job is to predict and prevent such attacks, but America's top spy agency has a spotty record when it comes to the war against radical Islam. While radical Islam was heating up during the 1990s, the C.I.A. was drawing down. Under the Clinton administration, the agency closed bases all over the world, including one in Hamburg, Germany, where Mohammed Atta and others planned 9-11. The C.I.A. was still reeling from 9/11 when the debate over invading Iraq began. *Washington Examiner* correspondent Rowan Scarborough says the C.I.A. is an agency in crisis. His new book, *Sabotage*, describes a C.I.A. blinded by Bush hatred and resistant to reform. CBN Host Pat Robertson talks live with Rowan Scarborough *Washington Examiner* reporter and author of *Sabotage American's Enemies within the CIA*. The CIA has become political and liberal and they leak false allegations and two years later a Commission looks into the allegations and finds them having no credit. It became more liberal in the 90s; Bush inherited a broken CIA. Ex-CIA people formed an association to try and prove Bush responsible for 9-11. Ray McGovern was an adviser to the administration and now he's using his CIA status to discredit President Bush. We haven't yet penetrated al Qaeda; Islam wants a nuclear bomb badly and they want to do massive attacks. The watch list we have now is better than the one we had in 2001.

Erick Stakelbeck CBN News Terror Analyst: Preventing radioactive materials from falling into the wrong hands is the main mission of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. But a recent undercover operation by congressional investigators resulted in a failing grade for the NRC. The team created a fictional company and applied for a license with the agency. Not only did they get the license, they used it to buy materials for a radiological dirty bomb. "It was much too easy ... to get the licenses that would have allowed individuals setting up a dummy corporation to obtain enough materials to create a dirty bomb," Sen. Norm Coleman, R-Minn., said. Convicted al-Qaeda operative Dhiren Barot planned to detonate a dirty bomb on American soil as did enemy combatant Jose Padilla. Some experts call these bombs "Weapons of Mass Disruption." They don't create a large explosion, and aren't likely to cause many casualties -- at least, at first. What makes dirty bombs dangerous is the radiation released into the atmosphere. The more radiation in the bomb, the larger the area it would affect. And the contamination could linger for months, if not years. Kristin Gossel heads the Department of Homeland Security's Ready Campaign says "Not all Americans have taken steps to prepare". Security experts told CBN News it's not hard to build a crude dirty bomb, especially with so many loose radioactive materials floating around. A small scale dirty bomb attack -- like in the subway tunnels of a major city -- is the most likely possibility. With al-Qaeda actively seeking to deliver on this threat, all Americans need to be prepared and stay informed.

Charlene Israel [CBN News](#) - Four months have passed since a student went on a shooting rampage and killed 32 people at Virginia Tech. As the fall semester begins, safety is on the minds of parents and students alike. CBN News examined campus security and what's being done to protect students as they head back to class. The Virginia Tech massacre impacted colleges and universities nationwide with many having since made campus security a top priority. "We've looked at the lessons learned from Virginia Tech and went back and looked at our protocol and our procedures and how we protect our students, faculty and staff and see if there's anything we can do better based on the lessons learned," Rudolph Burwell, assistant chief of campus police at Norfolk, Virginia's Old Dominion University, said. Virginia Tech officials turned down CBN News' request for an interview, but in a letter to parents of new students, administrators outlined several new security policies. For instance, all dorms will be locked 24 hours a day, accessible only to student residents with an electronic pass. Students can register for the new emergency notification system and older door locks will be replaced with exit bars that cannot be chained from the inside which happened during the shootings. Like Virginia Tech, many universities now use emergency text messaging systems that can alert students via cell phones and email. "They started something new this year. Whenever there's a problem, they send out text messages to give you a warning if anything's going to happen like another threat like what happened earlier this year at Virginia Tech, so that we can be safe," one Old Dominion freshman said. Despite the tragic shooting at Virginia Tech, school officials say enrollment is up and students are moving in and moving forward. But some parents are so concerned they're using the popular Web site Facebook.com to inspect and screen their kids' incoming college roommates.
